Kentucky led all states in percentage growth in construction employment late last year. With new manufacturing plants and an accelerating population growth, the state appears poised for further increases in construction. But there are headwinds, as well. Hear what segments are likely to grow and which are vulnerable as AGC of America's chief economist, Ken Simonson, peers into his crystal ball.
